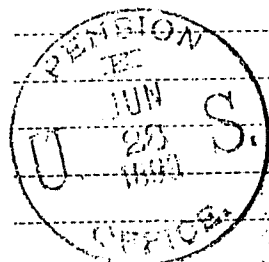

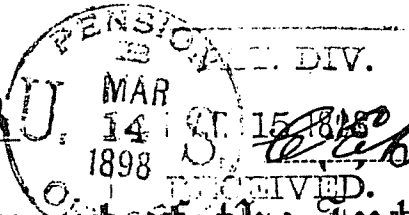

of October; in the year 1863; that while in the service aforesaid, and in the
line of his duty, he contracted paralysis of the left leg through
its whole extent, caused by sun stroke received while on
duty near Munster Junction, Pa., on the 15th day of

since being obliged to walk with crutches. He also says that
his left arm is partially paralyzed, by the same cause, and
that he has but little strength in it and can make but little
use of it.

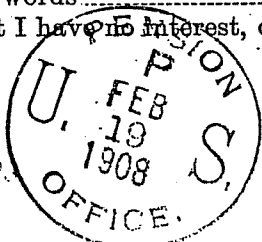

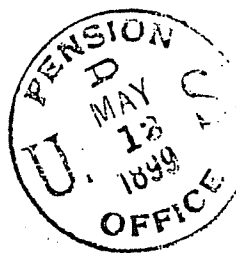

In relation to your enquiry
in regard to Cyrus R. Tied I would most
respectfully reply.

The facts in the case as far as I am
cognizant are these He had been on detached
service and joined the Regiment for duty on
or about July 15th on Saturday the 1st of August
while on the march from Warrenton Junction to
Greenwich (an excessive hot day) he fell in the
ranks, my attention was immediately called
I found him insensible, the usual remedies
restored consciousness, and he was put in an
ambulance on reaching camp I found his left
leg paralysed, he continued in the same condition
while with the Regiment, on the 6th of August
we transferred him to Hospital at Alexandria,
his subsequent history I know nothing

Inf Vols, personally appeared Dr Oliver
of Rutte whom I certify to be a regular
practicing physician in good standing
and who first being duly sworn
deposes and says

I have been intimately acquainted
with Mr. Cyrus R. Feed for the past
two years, during which time I have
noticed his infirmities, which are of a
nervous character, dating back, he says
to an attack of coup de soleil while in
the late war.

I first noticed the difficulty ^{with}
his right eye, which appeared to be a
paralysis of the palpebral muscles.

Upon examination and inquiry I
found however that the paralysis involv
all the recti muscles, including the
ciliary muscle and optic nerve, causing
total blindness and complete paralysis
of all the ocular muscles, at times.

This ocular paralysis is not constant
but varies, becoming worse in propor
tion to the use or strain placed upon
the eye, and less when used less; at

times this difficulty is scarcely noticeable.
I have also noticed the parietic condition of his lower limbs and right arm, while treating him for other troubles.

The difficulty with his lower extremities varies like that of his eye, from almost total paralysis of both sensory and motor nerves, to almost a normal condition, depending upon the amount of exercise performed by the parts involved, just as the condition of the eye varies ⁱⁿ proportion to the strain placed upon it.

I have also observed that the left leg is more affected than the right; also that his right arm is similarly affected at times.

The doctor (C. R. Zed) is not a neurasthenic individual, therefore, his symptoms do not partake of any hysterical character whatsoever.

On the contrary, he is very firm, meditative and deliberate, in all his manners.

These conditions of weakened physical, nerve energy greatly incapacitates the doctor from all kinds of physical exertion, thus greatly interfering with his means of self support.

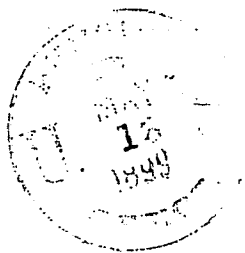
I have not treated doctor Leed for
this difficulty for several reasons; one
is I know of nothing that I can con-
scientiously recommend aside from ^{what}
he has already done, and what he now
does, which consists in extreme care
against exposure, and all kinds of
physical exertion. I have no interest
whatever in the prosecution of this claim.

Dear Madam:

Acknowledgment is made of the receipt of your letter dated September 28, 1938, requesting information relative to the above named veteran.

An examination of the case folder shows that Cyrus R. Teed, who was born in Masonville, Delaware County, New York, enlisted in Company F, 127th New York Infantry August 9, 1862 and was honorably discharged at 1st Division General Hospital, Alexandria, Virginia, by reason of disability on October 15, 1863. From enrollment to discharge he held the rank of corporal. There is nothing of record to show that he ever acted in a medical capacity during his period of service.


The personal description of the veteran as given by you is substantially correct with the exception that his age at enrollment is shown as twenty-four years.

In a questionnaire signed by the veteran on February 21, 1898, he stated that his wife, Celia M. Rows, whom he married April 13, 1857 in Meredith, New York, was dead, that he was at that time a widower, that he was not previously married and that he had one son, Arthur, born February 21, 1898.

The death of the veteran is reported to have taken place on December 22, 1908 at Estero, Florida.
